





SKIN

Hives, swelling (face, lips, tongue), itching, warmth, redness



RESPIRATORY (BREATHING)

Coughing, wheezing, shortness of breath, chest pain or tightness, throat tightness, hoarse voice, nasal congestion or hay fever-like symptoms, (runny, itchy nose and watery eyes, sneezing), trouble swallowing



GASTROINTESTINAL (STOMACH)

Nausea, pain or cramps, vomiting, diarrhea



CARDIOVASCULAR (HEART)

Paler than normal skin colour/blue colour, weak pulse, passing out, dizziness or lightheadedness, shock



OTHER

Anxiety, sense of doom (the feeling that something bad is about to happen), headache, uterine cramps, metallic taste

Dress Code

All staff, parents, students and visitors must wear the mandatory Islamic Dress Code (Hijab), which is as follows:



Girls age 5 – 7 years – have the option of wearing loose, long sleeved tops and long, loose pants with scarf and closed shoes.



Girls age 8+ years – Loose Abaya with head covering, socks and flat, closed shoes, no makeup or nail polish.



Boys – Plain, long-sleeved, loose shirt and long pants, socks and flat shoes or sneakers (No tight or ripped clothing, no skinny jeans, no graphics on shirts, no baseball caps, no earrings). No cellphones, mp3 players, gaming devices, etc. between 10:45 am - 2:30 pm.




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Google Classroom




- Classroom for each Dinyat and Quran class

Partnering for Success


- Review posts each week using link in e-mail OR accessing online classroom OR via google classroom App

Objectives of the Qur'an curriculum

To nurture our students to become connected to the Holy Quran through Recitation, Memorization and Tafseer.



Hifdh / Memorization

- Mandatory.
- Each class has been assigned to specific surahs Please refer to the first few pages of the Exploring Quran book for details.

- ★ Mubahitha (every student recites an ayah)
- ★ Using the 'Ayat-Al Quran' app (recited by Abdullah Basfar)

Quranic Arabic (new this year)

Quranic Arabic incorporated into regular Quran period for Q6 and up.

- ★ Each class Module consists of 10 lessons
- ★ Each lesson consists of introducing 5 words and two exercises to practise the words.

Plan to cover 1 lesson per month (spread over 2 weeks)


- Week 1: introduce the lesson with 5 new letters and do exercise 1
- Week 2: recap of week lesson and take up exercise 2



Tafseer lessons

- ★ Tafseer of the selected passage / surah
- ★ Exploring Al-Quran book for grade


We teach our lessons in a fun and interactive way: **some ideas include:** group discussions, Kahoot, Sketch it out (story, main idea), making connections to their everyday life.




Tafseer book - each grade will have their own book

Tajweed lessons

- ★ Term 1 review Tajweed rules of the previous years class, and bring all students to one level
- ★ Term 2 teaching the Tajweed rules assigned for your class

Tips/Guidelines for parents on how you can help your children grow closer to the Holy Quran

- Ask them what surah are they memorizing at madrassah.
- Practice recitation and memorization for at least 15 min per day
- Listen to the Holy Quran at home using different Apps or whilst driving.
- Encourage them to recite the surah they're trying to memorize at the dinner table, after salah, or when going on a drive, even if it is a few aayah.
- You can make it a team effort by telling them that you too are learning the surah with them!
- Everyone loves rewards treat them when they have learnt a sura or a tajweed rule.
- Take advantage of Quran Tutoring sessions for extra recitation practice





- 2 Rakah Salah, using audio file, tasbih (10x each)
- Followed by rhymes & ziyarat

Grade 3

- Demonstrate/practice one position and practice reciting one dhikr at least 5 times using Salah Tutor
- Dhuhr Salah using audio file
- Recitation of zohr dua, tasbih (10x each), rhymes, ziyarat

Grade 4,5,6

- Dhuhr & Asr Salah using audio files
- Recitation of zohr/asr dua, tasbih (10x each), rhymes, ziyarat
- Wudhu & Salah testing will be recorded in Report cards
- For Grade 5 & 6 work with students to correct errors and enhance salah

To recognize and encourage good behaviour


Max. 5 points for each of Quran or Dinyat class plus 1 point for Salaat = max. 11 points per day

For Salaat: 1 point for reciting out loud/leading salaat, adhaan, iqamah, tasbih, dua after salaat, or ziyarat

- All Volunteering activities count; must be performed on a volunteer basis (not a paid position).
- Suggested activities: fundraising for charity, helping at mosque programs, helping the elderly, visiting the sick, reading for those who are blind, teaching a skill, helping at food bank or shelter, etc.
- 4. Minimum total # of hours performing community service during June, 2022-May, 2023:
 - Community Class: 5 hours
 - Grades 1-4: 5 hours
 - Grades 5-8: 10 hours
 - Grades 9-YF: 20 hours


